• 2008-09 marks Tennessee's 100th season of varsity basketball. A season-long centennial celebration includes the selection of a Tennessee Basketball All-Century Team. Ballots are available in the Thompson-Boling Arena concourse for all home games.

• In its last game, Tennessee defeated Middle Tennessee 76-66 in Murfreesboro, Tenn., last Friday. The Vols had at least four players score in double figures for the third straight game.

• The Vols shot 76.9 percent (20-26) from the free-throw line at Middle Tennessee.

• UT head coach Bruce Pearl is three wins shy of logging his 400th career victory. Pearl was the second-fastest to reach 300 wins among active head coaches (382) games, trailing only current UNC head coach Roy Williams (370 games). See Page 3 for more on Pearl's march to win No. 400.

• Tennessee owns a 5-2 all-time record against current members of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference but has never faced a MAAC opponent during the Bruce Pearl era.

• The Vols own a 2-1 record in the state of Florida during the Bruce Pearl era, with all games taking place in Gainesville against Southeastern Conference rival Florida.

• The Vols return a total of six letterwinners, including two starters, from last year's squad that posted a 31-5 overall record and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.

• UT newcomers include four true freshmen, one junior-college transfer and a redshirt freshman.

• A panel of SEC and national media tabbed the Vols as the preseason favorite to win the Southeastern Conference championship this season. Tyler Smith was named the preseason SEC Player of the Year by the panel and also was a first-team All-SEC selection by the league's coaches.

Tennessee Trends

- Tennessee has had two players record double-doubles in each of its first two games this season.
- Tennessee is 47-2 at Thompson-Boling Arena since the start of the 2005-06 season.
- UT has a 34-game homecourt winning streak. The Vols' last home loss was a 78-80 decision to Kentucky in the final home game of the 2005-06 season.
- The Vols are 25-0 in non-conference home games under Bruce Pearl.
- Bruce Pearl is 16-8 against ranked teams while at Tennessee.
- The Vols have made at least one 3-pointer in 358 consecutive games.
- Under Bruce Pearl, UT is 73-6 when leading or tied with five minutes left in the game.
- UT is 52-5 when scoring 80 or more points under the direction of Bruce Pearl.
- Tennessee has an all-time record of 1,425-908-2 in 100 seasons of basketball.
- UT's 634 regular-season SEC victories rank third all-time in the SEC. Only Kentucky and Alabama have won more league games.
- Tennessee is 247-86 in 22 seasons in Thompson-Boling Arena. The Vols have posted winning home records in 18 of their 21 full seasons in the facility.
- Tennessee is the only Division I school ever to rank in the top five nationally in attendance for football, men's basketball and women's basketball in the same season. The Vols turned the trick for the fifth time in 2007-08.

The Siena Series

Thursday's Thanksgiving matchup marks the first-ever meeting between Tennessee and Siena on the hardwood ... Like Bruce Pearl, Siena assistant coach Mitch Buonaguro is an alum of Boston College.

Noting Siena

Siena (2-0) was unanimously picked by the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference head coaches to win the MAAC championship this season as the Saints are led by head coach Fran McCaffery and preseason conference player of the year Kenny Hasbrouck (Sr., 6-3, 194) ... Hasbrouck is one of three Saints named to the preseason All-MAAC first team, joining teammates Edwin Ubiles and Alex Franklin ... *Sports Illustrated* placed the Saints 29th in its preseason poll ... Siena junior Ronald Moore is a candidate for The Bob Cousy Award, presented to the nation's top point guard ... Siena, which posted a 23-11 (13-5 MAAC) record last season and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, is considered to boast the MAAC's top backcourt and frontcourt this year ... All five starters return from the 2007-08 team that defeated Vanderbilt in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament ... McCaffery owns a 60-36 record in his fourth season with the Saints and has put together a respectable non-conference schedule that features Pittsburgh and defending national champion Kansas, in addition to Tennessee ... The Saints experimented with lineup combinations while posting a 4-1 record during a trip to Italy this past summer ... One of the most talented and experienced mid-majors in the country, Siena's intangibles are among its biggest strengths this season.

Vols Getting Boost Off Bench

Through UT's first three games, the Vols are getting an average of 36.3 points off the bench ... Tennessee's bench has outscored the opponents' bench in all three of UT's games thus far for a total of 109-46 ... The Vols' bench totaled 44 and 47 points in home wins over Chattanooga and UT Martin, respectively ... Backup center Brian Williams scored a game-high 21 points against UT Martin for UT's highest non-starter output of the season.

Double-Doubles the Norm Early This Season

Tennessee players have recorded five double-doubles in just three games this season ... Two Vols posted double-doubles in each of UT's two home wins ... Junior center Wayne Chism is nearly averaging a double-double with 11.0 ppg and 9.7 rpg ... Chism's two double-doubles on the year lead the team ... Other Vols who have logged a double-double include Bobby Maze (12 pts, 11 rebs vs. Chattanooga), Tyler Smith (18 pts, 10 rebs at Middle Tennessee) and Brian Williams (21 pts, 12 rebs vs. UT Martin).

Hopson's Debut Nets Him

SEC Freshman of the Week Honors

Scotty Hopson's 17-point performance in UT's season-opening win over Chattanooga (11/15/08) earned him SEC Freshman of the Week honors ... In his 19 minutes played, he also logged three rebounds, one block and one steal while going 7-of-11 from the floor (3-of-6 from 3-point range) ... One of his four dunks in the 114-75 rout was featured on ESPN SportsCenter's Top-10 Plays.

**Vols Dish Out School-Record
32 Assists in Season-Opening Rout**

The Vols made history Nov. 15 in their season-opening rout of Chattanooga by dishing out a school-record 32 assists ... The previous record was 31 assists against Tennessee Tech on Nov. 25, 1988 ... Ironically, that game also was a season-opening rout, as UT pounded the Golden Eagles 118-86 to open coach Don DeVoe's 11th and final season on Rocky Top ... Junior point guard Bobby Maze led the way in this season's record-breaking performance with a game-high 11 assists (against only one turnover) in his official Tennessee debut ... Forward Tyler Smith added seven assists apiece, and guard J.P. Prince logged five ... Nine of the 11 Vols who played against the Mocs recorded at least one assist ... It tied for the 15th-highest single-game assist total in SEC history and was the most by an SEC team since 2006.

Middle Tennessee Recap

The Vols made their first trip to Middle Tennessee's Murphy Center in Murfreesboro, Tenn., since 1988 last Friday and handed the Blue Raiders a 76-66 loss in front of 11,802 ... In UT's first road test of the season, Tyler Smith led the Vols with 18 points, 10 rebounds and four assists ... Point guard Bobby Maze added 12 points, while Scotty Hopson and J.P. Prince scored 10 apiece ... Tennessee had an uncharacteristic nine assists against 16 turnovers but shot 55.3 percent from the floor ... Middle Tennessee shot 47.2 percent from the floor and went 12-for-25 at the free throw line ... The Vols' free-throw percentage of 76.9 (20-for-26) was the team's highest in 23 games ... UT led 36-32 at the half ... Tennessee got 18 points from its bench, while the Blue Raiders bench totaled 16 points ... The Vols were 4-of-8 from 3-point range, with Hopson going 2-for-2 from long range ... UT outrebounded Middle Tennessee 38-23 ... Guards Demetrius Green and Nigel Johnson led Middle Tennessee with 17 and 13 points, respectively.

Bruce Pearl has 505 games of collegiate head coaching experience under his belt, and he is just three wins shy of logging his 400th career victory ... As long as the Volunteers win three games before playing in 16 more, Pearl is assured of becoming the sixth-fastest coach ever to reach the 400-win milestone ... That would place him ahead of legendary coaches such as Phog Allen, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith and Lou Carnesecca just to name a few ... Thompson-Boling Arena is hosting its 22nd season in 2008-09 ... The Vols have won 74.1 percent of their games in Thompson-Boling Arena and have ranked in the top 10 nationally in attendance nine times, including in 2007-08 when UT ranked fourth nationally with 20,267 fans per game.

- Tennessee is 247-86 (.742) in its 22nd season in Thompson-Boling Arena.
- Since the 1998 season, the Vols are 147-27 (.845) in Thompson-Boling Arena.

Vols Coming Off Ninth SEC Title

Last season, Tennessee secured its ninth Southeastern Conference regular-season championship and the school's first in eight years with a 14-2 SEC record ... It was UT's first outright title (not shared with any other school) since the 1966-67 squad won the conference crown with a 15-3 league record ... Tennessee has won SEC titles in 1936, 1941, 1943, 1967, 1972, 1977, 1982, 2000 and 2008 ... The Vols won their fourth SEC Eastern Division title last season, including their second in three years under the direction of head coach Bruce Pearl.

Negedu One of 12 Foreign SEC Players, Speaks Four Languages

Freshman forward Emmanuel Negedu is one of a dozen foreign players on Southeastern Conference rosters this season ... Negedu is a native of Kaduna, Nigeria ... Vanderbilt leads the SEC with four foreign players on its 2008-09 roster ... Negedu speaks four different languages: English, Hausa, Igala and Nigerian Pidgin ... Native speakers of Hausa are found mostly in the African country of Niger and in the north of Nigeria ... Igala is spoken by the Igala ethnic group of Nigeria ... Nigerian Pidgin is an English-based pidgin or creole language spoken across Nigeria and is often referred to simply as Pidgin, Broken English or Broken ... And while Negedu also *understands* the Yoruba language, he cannot speak it fluently.

Strength & Conditioning Notes

Tennessee basketball strength and conditioning coach Troy Wills has an impressive group of athletic specimens to work with this season ... This is the first season Wills can remember in which he's ever had 10 players put up double-digit reps on the 185-pound bench press max test ... Eight of those 10 can do at least 15 reps of 185 pounds, led by Steven Pearl's 25 reps and Brian Williams' 21 reps ... Emmanuel Negedu and Josh Tabb's times of 3.02 and 3.03 seconds in the 3/4-court sprint test would rank among the top 10 among all players ever tested at the NBA combine ... Tyler Smith's time of 10.00 seconds in the lane-agility test ranks among the top five among all players ever tested at the NBA combine ... Emmanuel Negedu's broad jump of 9-foot-9-inches is the longest ever by a UT freshman ... Freshman guard Scotty Hopson has gained nearly 15 pounds since enrolling at UT this past summer.

If Tennessee scores at least 90 points in home games this season, fans can redeem that game's ticket stub at Knoxville-area Chick-fil-A restaurants for a free chicken sandwich ... UT already has scored 90 at home twice this season: 114 points vs. Chattanooga (11/15/08), 91 points vs. UT Martin (11/18/08) ... West Ruled Ineligible, Will Not Play for UT This Season

True freshman point guard Daniel West was ruled ineligible during the first week of November and will not play for the Vols this season ... West had been sidelined since official team practice began on Oct. 17 with an eligibility clearance issue, and his future enrollment status at UT has not been determined ... The Saginaw, Mich., native (who had been enrolled since the summer), did not dress for either of UT's exhibition games leading up to his ineligibility ruling.

Vols Earning Lots of TV Time

All but one of Tennessee's 30 regular-season games will be televised, including 15 nationally-televised matchups ... Tennessee joins Kentucky and Florida as the third Southeastern Conference team ever to have all of its SEC games televised ... Thompson-Boling Arena is hosting ESPN College Gameday on Jan. 31 for the clash against Florida ... That game is one of 11 on the ESPN family of networks this season ... The Vols play on Raycom Sports eight times, CBS four times, SportSouth four times, FSN once and CSS once (all during the regular season).

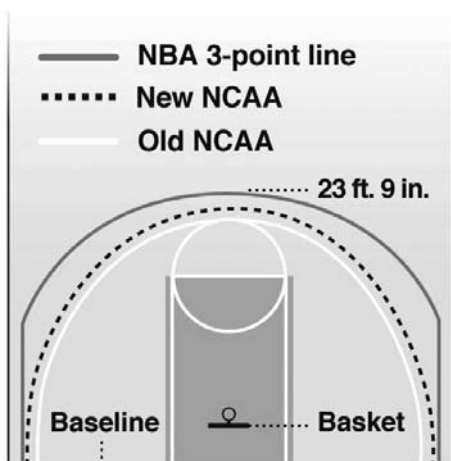

Pearl's Take on the New 3-Point Line

A noteworthy change to the men's college game this season is the moving of the 3-point line from 19'9" to 20'9" ... The desired effect of this change is to extend the game and open up the interior (also making physical interior play more visible to officials) ... UT head coach Bruce Pearl, who voted against the change, said, "I don't know if it's going to open the lane up more. I think it will make zone defenses much more effective. The matchup zone will make a comeback." ... Pearl added that the men's game will see less hedging out to challenge a shooter as a result of the new line ... Tennessee ranked 11th (9.3) and 25th (8.7) among Division I teams the last two seasons, respectively, in 3-pointers made per game.

UT Men, Women Combine For Second-Most Total Wins Among NCAA Division I Schools

Tennessee's men's and women's teams combined to post 67 total wins last season; marking the second-highest combined win total of any school in America ... The Vols won a school-record 31 games, while the Lady Vols racked up 36 victories en route to the program's eighth national championship ... North Carolina led the nation with 69 total wins between its men's (36) and women's (33) teams.

Hall Inks with UT During Early Signing Period

UT head coach Bruce Pearl announced on Nov. 12 that Stone Mountain, Ga., native Kenny Hall signed a National Letter of Intent to attend UT and play for the Volunteers beginning in the 2009-10 season ... A 6-foot-8, 215-pound forward, Hall currently attends Redan High School in metro Atlanta and is expected to enroll at Tennessee next summer ... As a junior last year at Redan, Hall averaged 20 points and 10 rebounds per game while leading the Raiders to a 14-win season ... He also was a first-team selection on the *Atlanta Journal-Constitution's* 2008 Georgia Class 5A All-State Team ... ESPN ranks Hall as the No. 55 overall prospect in the country, and

Scout.com rates Hall as a four-star prospect and the nation's No. 9 power forward ... The defending Big East regular-season champion Georgetown Hoyas (28-6, 15-3) are ranked 21st by the AP and 16th in the ESPN/*USA Today* Coaches' poll ... Fifth-year head coach John Thompson III returns three starters off last season's squad ... Junior forward DaJuan Summers highlights the Hoyas front line after averaging 11.1 ppg, 5.4 rpg and 1.5 apg in 2007-08 ... The highly touted freshman duo of Greg Monroe (6-11, 250) and Henry Sims (6-10, 225) will be called upon to contribute early this season ... A McDonald's All-America selection and Louisiana's Mr. Basketball each of the last two years, Monroe can play center or power forward for the Hoyas ... Sims is a very long-armed athlete who averaged a double-double at Mount St. Joseph HS in Baltimore, Md. ... 6-4 sophomore Austin Freeman started 23 games last season and adds experience to the Georgetown lineup ... 6-9 sophomore Julian Vaughn transferred from Florida State last season due to an illness in his family, and much like Tennessee's Tyler Smith, was granted an NCAA waiver so that he won't have to sit out this season ... The Hoyas backcourt features senior Jessie Sapp, who started every game the past two seasons, along with point guard Chris Wright ... Wright, a sophomore and former McDonald's All-America, only played in 16 games last season due to a severe ankle sprain ... Thompson is expected to have his Hoyas playing a much faster-paced style of basketball this season ... Georgetown is off to a 2-0 start this season, with wins over Jacksonville and Drexel.

The Georgetown Series

Tennessee's only previous clash with Georgetown came during the 2003 NIT, when the Hoyas handed the Vols a 70-60 loss on March 18 in Thompson-Boling Arena ... SEC Player of the Year Ron Slay led the Vols with 17 points and also grabbed eight rebounds ... Elgrace Wilborn tied a UT single-game record by blocking six shots, and he also pulled down a season-high 11 rebounds ... Georgetown used a 12-1 run early in the second half to pull away after Tennessee led 27-26 at the half ... Mike Sweetney led the Hoyas with 17 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks.

Looking Ahead at Wichita State

Head coach Gregg Marshall is in his second season at Wichita State and is coming off a campaign in which the Shockers finished 11-20 (4-14 MVC) ... Marshall's squad returns five players but just one starter from a season ago, and the Shockers were picked by the Missouri Valley Conference head coaches to finish ninth in the league this season ... Wichita State started the 2008-09 season 1-1 and was slated to host Centenary Monday night ... 18 of the Shockers' 20 losses last season were by 11 points or less ... WSU also lost three straight MVC games in overtime ... The lone returning starter this season is senior forward Ramon Clemente, who averaged seven points and eight rebounds as a junior ... Junior guard A.J. Hawkins, a transfer from St. Bonaventure, sat out last season and is coming off off-season toe surgery; he started every game as a sophomore in 2006-07 with the Bonnies ... Eight of WSU's 12 scholarship players are either freshmen or sophomores, and many join Hawkins as players who are coming off of injuries/surgeries ... Returning contributors J.T. Durley, Graham Hatch and Mantas Griskenas will provide experience ... Aside from Hawkins, five other newcomers have been added to the mix; that group is highlighted by seven-foot freshman Garrett Stutz ... Freshmen swingmen David Kyles and Toure' Murry are versatile enough to play at the 1, 2 and/or 3 spot ... Marshall also added a pair of juco guards in Reggie Chamberlain (Seward [Kan.] CC) and Clevin Hannah (Chipola [Fla.] College).

Tennessee is winless in two previous meetings with Wichita State; both games took place at neutral sites (as would a meeting at this year's Old Spice Classic) ... SEC Success

Tennessee's 36 SEC wins over the last three seasons are the most in the conference over that period ... The Vols finished with the second-best record in the SEC in both of Pearl's first two years and captured the SEC title outright last season with a 14-2 record ... In 2005-06, the Vols won the SEC East with a 12-4 conference mark and then posted a 10-6 league mark in 2006-07 that tied for second in the East and in the overall league standings ... 2006 and 2007 NCAA champion Florida won 31 league games over the last three seasons.

More SEC Success

No team in the Southeastern Conference has a winning record against Tennessee since Bruce Pearl was named the head coach prior to the 2005-06 season ... Pearl has recorded at least two wins against every SEC team in his three years in Knoxville.

Can I Get A Witness?

Tennessee has ranked in the top five nationally in attendance in each of Bruce Pearl's three seasons in Knoxville ... In 2005-06, UT enjoyed the largest increase in attendance in the nation (5,504 per game) to rank fifth nationally with an average of 17,954 ... Attendance continued to grow in his second season as the Vols ranked fourth nationally with 19,661 per game ... Last season, the Vols were watched by an average of 20,267 fans each home game, which ranked fourth nationally and was the second-largest attendance average in school history ... In Pearl's three seasons, attendance has grown by 7,817 fans per game.

Can I Get A Ticket?

For the second time in Thompson-Boling Arena history, Tennessee has sold out all of its 16,000 season tickets ... Prior to the 2007-08 campaign, the previous record for season ticket sales was 13,929 in 1987, the first year Thompson-Boling Arena was open.

Giving Back

Pearl is one of the most popular speakers in the state, speaking to hundreds of student groups, civic organizations and clubs throughout Knoxville and the state of Tennessee each year ... Along with U.S. Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice and Democratic National Committee chair Howard Dean, Pearl was asked to address 3,500 participants at the General Assembly of United Jewish Communities and the Federations of North America in November 2007 ... He also is known for standing on a chair at the University Center cafeteria during the lunch hour to gain student support for the team.

We Are Family

Being part of the Tennessee family is important to Pearl as he works tirelessly to promote all sports at Tennessee ... He asks his players to support the other teams at UT as those teams support basketball ... At a Lady Vols basketball game two seasons

ago, he joined five of his players as they painted their chests and cheered from the student section ... After Lady Vols' coach Pat Summitt returned the favor at a men's game later in the season Pearl said, "It's a pretty strong family here. How can you lose when you've got that kind of family support?"

Classroom Commitment

Tennessee's success on the court hasn't come at the expense of academics ... Nine members of the basketball team earned Academic All-SEC recognition in 2006-07 and six players appeared on the SEC Academic Honor Roll last season ... Senior Ryan Childress received his Communications studies degree in August, and senior walk-on Justin Jackson also is playing this season as a graduate student.

Style Points

Tennessee has been one of the highest-scoring teams in the nation the last three years, finishing the 2006-07 season ranked ninth nationally with 80.9 points per game and ranking sixth in the country last season with 81.8 ppg ... Pearl's teams have led their conference in scoring 15 of the 16 years he has been a head coach ... Tennessee has led the Southeastern Conference in scoring in each of Pearl's first three seasons ... Defense has also been a key ingredient to UT's success, as the Vols have led the league in steals in each of the last three years, including a school record 336 pilfers in 2006-07.

Tony Jones

4th Season at Tennessee*

Tony Jones is entering his fourth season as an associate head coach at Tennessee and his seventh on Bruce Pearl's coaching staff.

Jones' responsibilities include recruiting, scheduling and working with the Vols' perimeter players. An instrumental force in landing some of the influential players in his team's successes, he has made in-roads to signing a number of the top players in the nation. In two of his three seasons at Tennessee, Jones helped the Vols sign recruiting classes that have been ranked among the top 10 in the nation and have included the likes of Wayne Chism and Scotty Hopson.

"We are very fortunate to have one of the top assistants in the nation here at the University of Tennessee," Pearl said. "Tony Jones played collegiately in the state of Tennessee and has a wealth of knowledge and experience that make him a highly effective coach. I wouldn't have made it to Tennessee without Tony at my side."

Jones came to Tennessee with 12 seasons of collegiate coaching experience after spending four seasons at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (UWM) as an associate head coach. Prior to joining the UWM staff, Jones spent five seasons at Toledo and three years at Buffalo.

In his 15 seasons of collegiate coaching, Jones has helped direct his teams to eight postseason tournament bids, including five NCAA Tournament appearances the last six years. Three times (2005, 2007 and 2008) in the past four years he has coached teams appearing in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.

Tennessee has experienced unprecedented success during the three years with Jones on the bench. The Vols have averaged 25.6 wins during those seasons and have won two SEC Eastern Division championships. The 2008 team captured the overall SEC title outright for the first time in 41 years, won a school record 31 games and earned the first No. 1 ranking in school history after beating Memphis on Feb. 23.

Each of his three seasons at UT have resulted in NCAA Tournament appearances, including two that have advanced to the Sweet 16. Two times the Vols have received No. 2 seeds in the NCAA Tournament which are the highest in school history.

After helping sign a class that was ranked sixth nationally in 2006, Jones was named one of the top recruiters in the nation by Rivals.com. In 2007 Rivals.com ranked Jones as one of the five top assistant coaches in the nation.

Jones got his first taste of coaching at his alma mater, Detroit Southwestern High School, where he served as an assistant varsity coach while also serving as head junior varsity coach from 1986-91. During this time he coached future NBA stars Jalen Rose (Phoenix Suns), Howard Eisley (Denver Nuggets) and Voshon Lenard (Portland Trail Blazers), leading them to the mythical *USA Today* national title in 1991. He also served as head coach of Team AAU Michigan for three years (1991-93), posting a 35-1 record and capturing two AAU state championships.

Jones was an all-city star at Southwestern and went on to earn all-conference honors at Fisk University in Nashville. He earned a bachelor's degree in health care administration from Concordia (Mich.) University.

Jones and his wife, Pam, have four children - Tony II, Jamaal, Mercedes and Porscha. His brother, Bill, is a former member of the NBA's New Jersey Nets and is currently the head coach of the ABA's Detroit Panthers.



Steve Forbes

*Assistant Coach
Southern Arkansas, 1998
3rd Season at Tennessee*

Veteran coach Steve Forbes is in his third season on the Tennessee staff.

Forbes and Pearl first got to know each other when Pearl was an assistant at Iowa. The Vols have been the direct beneficiaries of the two working together.

In the two seasons Forbes has sat alongside Pearl on the Tennessee bench, the Vols have won a total of 55 games and advanced to back-to-back Sweet 16s in the NCAA Tournament.

The Vols have led the Southeastern Conference in steals in each of his two seasons in Knoxville, and in 2008 they also led the league in 3-point field goal percentage by holding teams to just 31.2 percent shooting.

The Vols won a school-record 31 games in 2008 and their 14-2 league record gave the school its first outright SEC championship in more than 40 years. Following a 66-62 win at top-ranked Memphis on Feb. 23, 2008, UT earned the first No. 1 ranking in school history.

In his first season at UT, Forbes helped direct the Vols to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament with wins over Long Beach State and Virginia. UT's 24 wins that season ranked second in school history at the time.

Listed as the No. 8 assistant coach in the nation by FOXSports.com, Forbes has played a key role in recruiting top talent to Knoxville. Tennessee's 2008 recruiting class was highlighted by McDonald's All-America Scotty Hopson and was ranked seventh in the nation by Rivals.com.

Forbes came to Tennessee after spending two seasons at Texas A&M, where he helped turn the Aggies from a team that had posted a 7-21 record the previous season and hadn't received a postseason invitation in 11 years, to a program that averaged more than 21 wins in his two seasons and advanced to postseason play both years. A&M posted back-to-back seasons with the most Big 12 Conference wins in school history with Forbes on the bench.

Texas A&M's recruiting also benefited from Forbes' experience, as each of the Aggie's two recruiting classes during his time in College Station were ranked among the top 10 in the nation.

Before joining Billy Gillispie's coaching staff at Texas A&M, Forbes coached at Illinois State (2003-04) and spent three years at Louisiana Tech (2000-03), where he helped sign two nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including a top-10 class in 2003. In 2002 the Bulldogs posted a 22-10 record and went 2-1 in the National Invitation Tournament, their first postseason appearance in 10 years.

In 1998 Forbes joined the Idaho coaching staff as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach for the 1998-99 season. In his first season, the Vandals improved to 16-11 and signed a nationally-ranked recruiting class.

Forbes compiled a 68-28 record in three years (1995-98) as the head coach at Barton County Community College in Great Bend, Kan.

A native of Lone Tree, Iowa, Forbes graduated from Southern Arkansas University with a degree in secondary education in 1988. A former baseball player for the Muleriders, Forbes spent one year at his alma mater as the sports information director before embarking on a coaching career.

Forbes and his wife, Johnetta, have a daughter, Elizabeth, and two sons, Christopher and Johnathon.



Jason Shay

*Assistant Coach
Iowa, 1995
4th Season at Tennessee*



Jason Shay is in his eighth season assisting Bruce Pearl, including his fourth year at Tennessee.

"I've known Jason since he was a player at the University of Iowa," Pearl said. "He has played in this system and believes in this style of basketball. He was an overachiever as a player and has continued to work hard as an assistant coach. His experiences have helped him make tremendous contributions to our players' individual development. He also possesses a keen basketball mind, and together we have been able to game plan effectively."

Shay, who is responsible for recruiting and scouting in addition to some administrative duties, came to Tennessee after spending four years on Pearl's staff at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (UWM). He was an assistant coach for UWM's two NCAA Tournament appearances after spending his first two seasons as the director of basketball operations for the Panthers.

Scouting reports put together by Shay have helped lead the Vols to an average of 25.7 wins per season his three years at Tennessee, including a school-record 31 wins in 2007-08. In 2005-06 the Vols won the SEC's Eastern Division championship, and in 2006-07 UT advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The 2007-08 Vols captured the school's first outright SEC title in 41 years and returned to the Sweet 16.

Shay drew the scouting assignment against top-ranked Memphis in 2007-08. Tennessee's 66-62 victory over the Tigers vaulted the Vols into the No. 1 spot in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls for the first time in school history.

Shay served as an assistant basketball coach and assistant sports information director at Mercyhurst College in Erie, Pa., before rejoining Pearl at UWM. He helped lead Mercyhurst to a top-five ranking in the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Region while assisting with on-court coaching strategies. Shay also was responsible for individual workouts, the team's strength program, film exchange, scouting reports and monitoring the academic progress of the student-athletes.

Shay played four seasons at the University of Iowa under the tutelage of Dr. Tom Davis. During that time, the Hawkeyes advanced to two NCAA Tournaments and won the 1992 San Juan Shootout. It was in Iowa City where Shay and Pearl first crossed paths, as Pearl was an assistant coach at Iowa from 1986-92.

He earned a bachelor's degree in Health Promotion at Iowa and a master's degree in Sports Management in 1998 from Western Illinois University.

Shay and his wife, Jana, have a daughter, Peija, and a son, Joah.



Ken Johnson

*Director of Operations
Albertson College of Idaho, 1993
4th Season at Tennessee*



Ken Johnson is in his fourth season at Tennessee and his 10th year as a member of Bruce Pearl's staff.

Johnson and Pearl first joined forces in 1999 when Johnson came to the University of Southern Indiana as an assistant coach, and the relationship continued when Pearl moved to the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. In the nine seasons Johnson has assisted Pearl, their teams have combined to post a 219-65 record.

"It is really important to surround young people with good role models," Pearl said. "Ken is a very hard worker who genuinely cares about these kids. He has been with me longer than anyone on my staff and he knows how I expect things to be done. He sets the bar high for our student-athletes and provides them with the guidance and support they require to be successful."

Johnson has seen the Vols succeed both on the court and in the classroom. In 2006-07 UT won the third-most games in school history while advancing to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Meanwhile, seven Vols were named to the 2006-07 SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll for their work in the classroom. During the 2007-08 season, Johnson kept the Vols focused in the classroom and the community while they compiled the best record in school history (31-5) on the court and placed six players on the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll.

At UWM, Johnson was responsible for working with the Panthers post players while also scouting opponents. During those four seasons, the Panthers posted an 86-38 record and received three postseason invitations, including a trip to the 2005 NCAA Tournament in which they advanced to the Sweet 16.

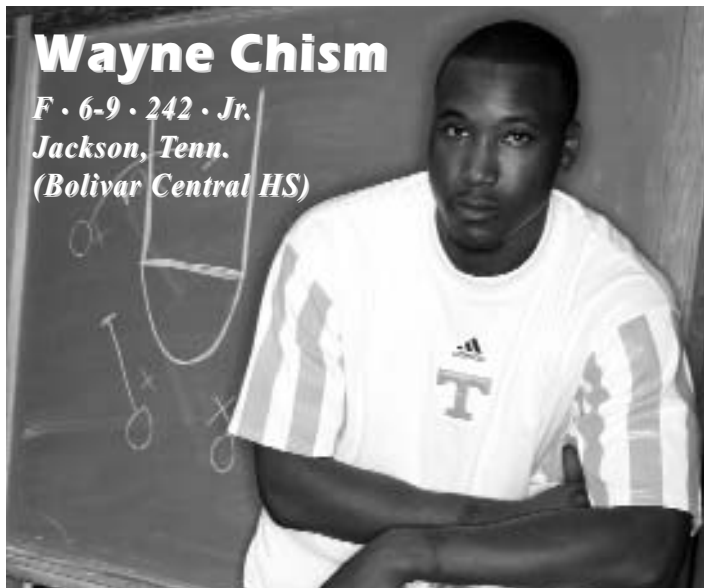
Johnson spent two seasons at USI as an assistant coach where he was responsible for video breakdown, scouting of opposing teams and individual player development.

During those two seasons, the Screaming Eagles posted a 51-10 record, won a Great Lakes Valley Conference championship and made two NCAA Division II Tournament appearances. USI earned No. 1 rankings in both of Johnson's seasons and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the 2000 NCAA Tournament.

Prior to joining Pearl's coaching staff at USI, Johnson spent two seasons as an assistant coach of the Idaho Stampede of the Continental Basketball Association.

Johnson began his collegiate playing career at Southwestern Oregon Community College where he was named to the all-freshman team in his rookie season. He later earned all-region honors as a sophomore at Salt Lake Community College. He then moved to Albertson College of Idaho where he garnered NAIA District II All-Conference honors. A 1993 graduate of Albertson College with a degree in physical education, he helped lead Albertson to a NAIA District II championship and played for the 1991 NAIA National Championship.

Johnson and his wife, Amber, have two daughters, Makenzee Ruth and Kenley Jade.
