### The Series with Wichita State

Overall - First Meeting

**Of Note** - This will be the first meeting between the two schools. The Old Spice Classic marks the second straight season Siena has competed in an in-season Tournament. The Saints went 1-1 in the NIT Season Tip-Off last year, losing to Syracuse and defeating Fairleigh Dickinson. In 2004-05 Siena took part in the BCA Classic in Raleigh, N.C. losing all three of its games. Siena's last in-season Tournament Championship came in December of 1998 when the program captured the Pepperdine Sparklets Invitational title with wins over Eastern Michigan and the host Waves. This is the third straight season a MAAC school has participated in the Old Spice Classic. Last year, Rider finished sixth. The Broncs defeated Penn State and lost to North Carolina State and Kansas State. In the 2006 event, Marist finished third posting wins over Minnesota and Western Michigan while losing to Arkansas.

#### Siena vs. the MVC

Siena has an 8-6 all-time record against the 10 schools in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Saints only have a losing all-time record against Evansville (1-2). Siena has also played Creighton (3-2), Northern Iowa (1-1), Bradley (1-0) and Southern Illinois (2-0). The most recent meeting with an MVC member was an 82-70 loss at Northern Iowa during the 2003-04 season.

## Quick Hits

- ▶ Siena made just 1-15 3-pointers in Thursday's loss
  - ✓ It was the poorest 3-point shooting performance and fewest 3's made in the Fran McCaffery era
  - ✓ The Saints are shooting 28% from 3-point range so far this season
  - ✓ The opposition is shooting 27.3%
  - ✓ The 3-point line was extended to 20 feet, 9 inches prior to this season
- ▶ Edwin Ubiles needs just 12 points to become the fourth fastest Saint in the Division I era to score his 1,000th career point
  - ✓ Ubiles made 6-14 shots against Tennessee, finishing with 14 points and four blocks
- ▶ Ryan Rossiter is averaging a double-double
  - ✓ Rossiter averaged just 1.9 points and 2.9 rebounds last season
  - ✓ He has made 70% of his field goals this season, and averaged 14.5 rebounds over the last two games
  - ✓ Rossiter has posted consecutive double-doubles after failing to do so in the first 35 games of his career
  - ✓ He added 15 pounds of muscle in the off-season and showed signs of his potential when he averaged a double-double on the team's five-game foreign tour of Italy
- ▶ Siena has out-rebounded its first three opponents this season
  - ✓ Siena out-rebounded just 10 of its 33 opponents last season and had a -4.3 team rebounding margin - worst in the MAAC
- ▶ The Saints have forced an average of 19 turnovers per game over the first three games
  - ✓ Uncharacteristically, Siena had 13 first half turnovers against Tennessee Thursday
- ▶ Kenny Hasbrouck shot just 1-10 from the field against the Vols
  - ✓ The Preseason MAAC Player of the Year has reached double figures in 75 of the 97 games he has played in his career and was the third fastest Saint to 1,000 points in the Division I era
  - ✓ Back court mate Ronald Moore made just 3-11 field goals and reserve guard Clarence Jackson shot 1-6 from the floor against Tennessee
  - ✓ Hasbrouck averaged 21 points, shot 56% from the field and made 5-8 3-pointers in Siena's first two games, earning MAAC Player of the Week honors Monday
- ▶ The Siena defense has held the opposition under 40% from the field in five of six halves this year
  - ✓ Still, because Tennessee shot 65% in the first half Thursday, opponents are shooting 40% from the field for the season
  - ✓ Opponents have scored just 62 points per game against Siena this season
- ▶ Four players are averaging double figures for the Saints
  - ✓ Last season three Saints (Ubiles, Hasbrouck and Franklin) averaged over 15 points per game
- ▶ Senior captain Josh Duell is yet to score this season
  - ✓ Duell, who started 15 games last year, has attempted just four field goals and has seen limited playing time as a result of a preseason Achilles' injury and the emergence of Rossiter
  - ✓ Junior forward Cory Magee has not played this season and is not on this trip (concussion)
- ▶ The ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll lists Siena 33rd in points received this week
  - ✓ Siena has 10 points in the poll and 18 in the AP Poll, which placed the Saints tied for 35th among schools receiving votes
  - ✓ Three teams in the Old Spice Class are in the top-12 of the poll
- ▶ This is one of at least seven nationally televised games Siena will play this season
  - ✓ McCaffery indicated the national television exposure the program would receive was a key decision in Siena's involvement in the Old Spice Classic

## Meeting with McCaffery

Each week head coach Fran McCaffery meets with media to discuss Siena basketball. Below are highlights from the most recent media luncheon (11/24) and yesterday's press conference.



### On the Loss to Tennessee

Midway through the first half, when you play a team of this caliber, the focus has to be: stay away from the big run, and certainly they had it. We fell apart a little bit for a very short period of team, at that point I struggled with whether to put Alex (Franklin) back in the game, but we talked about it and I wanted him to be able to play his game in the second half, so he wouldn't feel like he couldn't do the things he normally does. There's a lot of good things we did. That's a very good team. I think we played really good defense. We out-rebounded them, forced 19 turnovers. The problem, like I said, is decision-making, shot selection. We played the game plan we wanted to play. We did a good job in the half court. We did a good job in the press. We got it down to 13 in the first half and then started jacking threes, which is disappointing because that's one of the things we didn't want to do.

### On the Team's Defensive Improvement

That was a focal point coming into this season, to try to continue where we left off (last year). Last year we did not start the season very well defensively, nor were we very good in the middle of the season, but by the end of the season we were very good.

### On the Team's Rebounding Improvements

The last couple years we have been able to overcome our rebounding deficiencies because we don't turn it over, we make threes and we have a lot of guys who can score the ball. Again, with the upgrade in our schedule, rebounding was going to be something that has to be addressed. I've been saying since we got back from Italy that Rossiter is the guy. I think we saw Saturday that he is the guy.

### On playing three games in four days

For us it's particularly problematic, because it's a four-game road trip. And then we play Albany Saturday (Dec. 5). It's a lot of scouting for the assistants. Adam (Chaskin) had Cornell, he has Wichita State, he has Maryland and he has Loyola. That's a lot of tape review for him. Mitch (Buonoguro) has Tennessee, Michigan State and he's got Albany. When you're paying Thursday, Friday, Sunday, your main focus is Thursday and Friday. You regroup on Saturday no matter who it is, because in tournament situations you can live scout and we will have seen whoever we play Sunday twice in person. This is the most unique scouting situation. We will not address anyone other than Tennessee until we get to Thursday night.

### On whether the team now understands the focus needed to play good defense

It appears that way. I'm typically pretty calm. Last year, I really lost it a few times with our defensive breakdowns. It started in the scrimmages. The reason you have the scrimmages is they're dress rehearsals, so you don't make those mistakes when the games start. Well we were making the same mistakes in the beginning of January that we were making in October in our scrimmages. That's just unacceptable. That's what I pointed out to the team in no uncertain terms. The most since I've gotten here that I've ever gone off was after the game at Manhattan last year.

### On Edwin Ubiles' defensive focus

He was Rookie of the Year in the league (in 2006) and he didn't really play defense the whole year. Last year he played it in spurts. He never really derived any self esteem from his ability to stop people. It was always him scoring. What I've tried to get him to understand, and it started in the Vanderbilt game with Shan Foster, is that people are going to recognize this. We don't win that game if you don't lock up Shan Foster. The reality for him is he can really play defense. Looking long-term, selfishly for him, is if he can show the NBA people that he can play offense and defense equally well, he'll be in the league. But he's not going to get there solely on his ability to score. In that league, all the big time scorers are the 6-7 two guards. Those guys will absolutely torch you if you don't play defense. He gets his feet apart, he's long. He had (Cornell's Ryan) Wittman talking to himself by the end of that game.

### On NBA scouts at the Old Spice Classic

There's going to be a zillion. It's just so much easier to send somebody to one place. You go to Maui, there will be a bunch of them there. This is the highest-rated tournament, so there will be the most players to watch here. They're all going to watch Hasbrouck, Ubiles and Franklin, but they want to see them against Tyler Smith and Scotty Hobson.

## Scouting Siena

The Saints are coming off their first loss of the season - a 78-64 setback at the hands of SEC power Tennessee Thanksgiving day. Siena fell behind by 20 in the first half, and got no closer than nine following an 11-0 spurt to start the second half. The Vols held the Saints to just 1-15 from 3-point range and limited leading scorer Kenny Hasbrouck to just six points on 1-10 shooting. As a result, Siena falls into the Consolation Bracket of the Old Spice Classic where it will meet Wichita State Friday at 10:30 a.m. Junior Edwin Ubiles enters the contest just 12 points shy of his benchmark 1,000th career point. If he could get it against the Shockers, he would become the fourth fastest Saint in the Division I era, doing so in his 70th game. Hasbrouck reached the 1,000-point plateau in his 68th game last season.

## An A for the D

Siena's opponents have scored an average of just 62 points per game this year and shot 40% from the field. Last year, the Saints advanced to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament despite allowing its opponents to shoot 45.2% from the field. Even high-flying Tennessee, which entered their game with Siena averaging nearly 94 points per game, scored just 78 points and shot 39% from the field in the second half.

## Boarding School?

The Saints have not been known for their rebounding under head coach Fran McCaffery, but this season the team has out-rebounded all three opponents it has faced. McCaffery conceded that while the team made up for its rebounding deficiencies last year (a MAAC worst -4.3 rebounding margin) by doing other things well, that against this year's schedule rebounding would have to improve.

## A Star Emerging

Last season, Siena relied heavily on its "Fantastic Four"- Hasbrouck, Ubiles, Franklin and Moore, but through the first three games, it appears the Saints may have a Fab Five. Sophomore Ryan Rossiter is averaging 10 points and 10.7 rebounds, posting back-to-back double-doubles against Ivy League Champion Cornell and SEC Champion Tennessee. Rossiter has given the Saints a legitimate threat on the glass and a physical presence to counter Franklin's athleticism and offensive prowess.

## Approaching 1,000

Edwin Ubiles is just 12 points shy of his 1,000th career point. He entered the season with the second most points for any Siena player ever entering his junior campaign. Hasbrouck entered his junior season with 859 and Ubiles had nearly 100 more with 954. Ubiles would need to improve just slightly on his 14.5 points per game average in his final two seasons (assuming the Saints play a similar number of games) to reach the 2000-point plateau.

## Hasbrouck Honored

Kenny Hasbrouck was named MAAC Player of the Week for the first time in his career on Monday. The Preseason Player of the Year averaged 21 points and shot 56% from the field and 63% from 3-point range in a 2-0 week for the defending MAAC Champions. He scored 20 points in the Saints season-opening win over WAC Champion Boise State on 7-10 shooting in just 24 minutes of action. In Siena's win over defending Ivy League Champion Cornell, Hasbrouck again led all scorers with 22 points. He averaged 5.5 rebounds, three assists and 1.5 steals on the week as well.

## Turning up the Heat

Siena's pressure defense has forced an average of 19 turnovers the first three games. The Saints are averaging 9.3 steals per game. The Saints set a school record with 320 steals last year and ranked eighth nationally with 9.4 steals per game.

## MAAC Daddies

Siena is the unanimous choice to win the MAAC this season, according to the Preseason Coaches' Poll released October 28. It's the second straight year Siena was picked to win the league. Last year, Siena shared the regular-season title with Rider and defeated the Broncs in the MAAC title game. Senior Kenny Hasbrouck was named Preseason MAAC Player of the Year and juniors Edwin Ubiles and Alex Franklin were selected to the Preseason First Team. Hasbrouck and Ubiles were First Team All-League selections last year.

## Great Expectations

Not only are the Saints the unanimous choice to repeat their MAAC Championship and return to the NCAA Tournament, but national expectations surrounding the program are as high as they have ever been. Siena is receiving votes in both the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' top-25 poll and the Associated Press writer's top-25 poll. Several national magazines and websites have Siena ranked among the top-50 teams in their preseason polls. Hasbrouck was honored as the MAAC Preseason Player of the Year, while Ubiles and Franklin were named to the MAAC First Team.

## Foreign Engagements

The Saints got a jump start on the season with a 13-day, five game foreign tour August 16-29. Tour stops included: Como, Venice, San Marino, Florence, Siena and Rome. In addition to the once-in-a-lifetime experiences involved with visiting historic sites such as: Vatican City, the Grand Canal, Michelangelo's David, The Coliseum and many more, the team got a chance to bond with one another and tone their basketball skills against professional competition. Sophomores Clarence Jackson and Ryan Rossiter led the Saints to a 4-1 record on the trip. Jackson averaged nearly 20 points per game and Rossiter averaged a double-double.

## Anyone, Anytime

The Saints have assembled the most challenging schedule in the 66-year history of Siena basketball. Tonight's game with 2008 NCAA Tournament participant Boise State tips off an arduous non-conference slate. The Saints have already played three teams that advanced to last year's NCAA Tournament. Siena will also face National Champion Kansas (1/6), pre-season top-10 selection Pittsburgh (12/18) and 2008 NCAA Tournament participant St. Joseph's (12/28). Siena will have at least seven games nationally televised this season.

## Kenny's Quest

Kenny Hasbrouck already stands seventh on the school's all-time scoring charts with 1,453 career points. Should Siena play its minimum scheduled 31 games, Hasbrouck would need to average just over 19 points to become the school's third 2000-point scorer. If the Saints reach the MAAC finals, Hasbrouck would need to average 18 points over the 32 remaining games. Hasbrouck is fourth on the school's career steals charts with 182, 49 shy of all-time leader Marcus Faison '00.

## Moore Honored...Finally

Junior Ronald Moore has been selected as one of 31 finalists for the Bob Cousy award, presented annually to the nation's top point guard by the Basketball Hall of Fame. Moore has averaged 5.1 assists over his first two years and just 2.1 turnovers per game. Despite his gaudy numbers, and the fact that he makes the MAAC's top offense go, he has never been selected to an All-Conference Team - including this year's Preseason MAAC teams. Moore is the only MAAC point guard to be named a Cousy finalist.

## A's for Alex

Alex Franklin joined Ubiles and Hasbrouck on the Preseason MAAC First Team this year after earning second team recognition as a sophomore. Franklin scored 17 points and grabbed nine rebounds against Tennessee despite missing much of the first half with two fouls. As a sophomore he averaged 15.1 points and 7.8 rebounds per game.

## What's New

Freshmen Kyle Downey and Owen Wignot appear as if they will make a serious impact this season despite the return of Siena's veteran rotation. Downey was recruited as a shooting guard and can score from the perimeter, but he will add depth at point guard as well. In his debut, Downey was second on the team with 14 points, converting 7-8 from the line. Wignot is a combo forward and a superb athlete who has shown the ability to fill in on the inside when needed. He scored eight points and grabbed seven rebounds against Boise State. Freshman walk-on Conner Fenlon got some action in the last minute of the Boise State and Tennessee games as well.

## Their Back

The Saints return all five starters from last season. Additionally, Siena returns 86% of its scoring from last year's MAAC Championship team. Only senior Tay Fisher (graduation), freshman Chris DeLaRosa (transfer) and junior James Carr (transfer) do not return.

## Packing the Bags

Siena departed New York's Capital region for the most magical place on earth Tuesday afternoon. The team will not return until Thursday, December 4. Following the conclusion of the Old Spice Classic, the Saints head to Baltimore where they begin league play against Loyola Wednesday, December 3.
