The Series with Rider

Overall - Siena leads 19-9
 MAAC Games - Siena leads 15-7
 MAAC Tournament - Siena leads 2-0
 at Siena - Siena leads 10-4

Of Note - Siena leads the all-time series 19-9 and the Saints have won five of the seven games in the Fran McCaffery era. The two teams' last meeting was the most meaningful in the 32-year series history. Siena defeated Rider 74-53 in the MAAC Championship game to claim their third MAAC title and earn their fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament. Tay Fisher led four Saints in double figures with 21 points and six 3-pointers on his birthday. Kenny Hasbrouck contributed 17. The teams split the regular-season series last year with each team winning on the other's court. The Broncs dominated Siena 89-75 in an ESPN2 game in mid-January and Josh Duell's 3-pointer with 1.2 seconds left won the game in Lawrenceville and helped the Saints claim a share of the regular-season title.

Siena in the MAAC

The Saints are in their 20th season as a MAAC member owning a 185-133 all-time record in league play. The Saints have won or shared five MAAC regular-season titles (1991, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2008) and taken three MAAC Championships (1999, 2002 and 2008). Since the MAAC expanded to its current 10 teams in 1997-98, Siena has the second most league wins (123-79), trailing only Niagara (130-71). The Saints also have the best MAAC Tournament record (20-8) over the 11-year stretch. Siena has won 24 of its last 30 regular-season league games.

Quick Hits

- ▶ This game is a rematch of last year's MAAC title game
 - ✓ Siena defeated Rider here at Times Union Center 74-53 to capture the 2008 MAAC Championship
- ▶ The Saints had their five-game winning streak snapped Tuesday night in Kansas
 - ✓ It was the sixth game Siena has played against a team that advanced to the 2008 NCAA Tournament (3-3)
 - ✓ Siena has won five of its last six games and eight of its last 10
- ▶ Siena has won 11 straight games at Times Union Center
 - ✓ It's the team's longest home winning streak since the 1998-99 season (12 games)
 - ✓ Rider handed Siena its last home loss, 89-75 on February 2, 2008
 - ✓ The Saints are 7-0 at home this season
 - ✓ Kenny Hasbrouck is shooting 46% from the field in Siena's home games and the Saints are out-scoring their opponents 75.3-60.7
 - ✓ Ronald Moore has 49 assists and 18 turnovers and is shooting 44% from the field at home this season
- ▶ The Saints have won 24 of their last 30 regular-season MAAC games
 - ✓ Siena is 4-0 in the MAAC, equaling its best start under McCaffery (06-07)

 - ✓ Hasbrouck needs 13 points to become just the sixth player in school history to score 1,600 career points
- ▶ Alex Franklin is leading the Saints with 17.8 points and 7.3 rebounds in MAAC games this year

 - ✓ Franklin is third in the MAAC (to teammate Ryan Rossiter and Fairfield's Greg Nero) in field goal percentage (55%)
- ▶ Clarence Jackson is averaging a team-best 14.2 points and is shooting 49% from the field on the road this season
 - ✓ Jackson has averaged 11.7 points over the last seven games
 - ✓ He has reached double figures in two straight games and four times in the last seven after not doing so in any of the first eight
- ▶ Josh Duell left the Kansas game with a knee injury and will not play against rider
 - ✓ Duell suffered an Achilles' injury pre-season and was just getting back up to speed
 - ✓ His return to the lineup is uncertain

Meeting with McCaffery

(207-168 13th season; 68-41 at Siena 4th season)

Coach McCaffery's meets with the media each week.

Below are some of his comments from Thursday's media lunch.

On Rider

They're obviously much more perimeter oriented. They're an incredible collection of perimeter talent. They got guys who can drive and shoot, so they got everyone spread out. They can go with a small lineup, Ryan Thompson at the 4 spot or they can give him the ball and play him at the 1. But you got Lamar Johnson, Harris Mansell, two seniors who can really shoot the ball. Justin Robinson is playing extremely well, so is Matty Griffin so you go two really good point guards there.

On Ryan Thompson

I voted for him for Rookie of the Year, so in my mind he's kind of doing the same things he's always done. You know, he plays both ends, he rebounds, he drives it, he shoots it. I think he's probably a little better 3-point shooter than he was his freshman year, he's worked on that. But in terms of being able to go off the dribble, hit the post and basket-cut, block a shot and really impact the game with his intensity level, there's not been a whole lot of change. He's a guy who could ultimately be Player of the Year in this league. He's a matchup problem anywhere because he's going to play 1,2,3,4. He's got size as a 2, you know he's versatile as a 4. Last year was the first time they really started giving him the ball and running high ball screens for him, and he was a handful for just about everybody and they're still doing that.

On if Rider will approach this as a revenge game

I'm sure it is for them. Last year during the regular season we split with them, they came in here and drilled us pretty good and I'm sure they remember that, so do we. So, we recognize this is one of the premier teams in our league and they're coming in here expecting to knock us off and we have to be ready.

On Josh Duell

I don't know (when we will know his status), I hope (it's a sprain - hope it's nothing worse than that. We hope to find out (soon). He's not playing (against Rider), there's no way. I'm hopeful that it's just a sprain (and we) can get that thing healed up and get him back on the floor. Obviously it's a blow to our team, but when you have a guy like Josh Duell you feel really bad. You watch how hard he's worked to overcome injuries he's had, and now he's playing great and having a lot of fun his senior year. I feel bad for him. I hope we can get him to the point where he can help us at some point.

On the approach to MAAC games

To be honest with you, we won't approach it any differently; we really, legitimately go one game at a time. I know a lot of coaches say that, but we just focus on the next game and we try to focus on some things in the previous game that we need to address in terms of trying to get better. That's it, then we play them.

On his timeout strategy

It's pretty much a gut feeling, because if I feel like the game is completely getting away from us and the crowd is insane then I'll take one. This (25-1) run (in the Kansas game) was sort of methodical. We were coming down, we were running our stuff, seemingly couldn't get a basket and they were hitting every shot. But we were getting into our defense and we were contesting and a couple times we got to the foul line, they got to the foul line, stopped the clock, media timeout in there. It wasn't continuous play, you have to stop continuous play when you're on the wrong end of a run, but if play is stopping, there is no reason to stop it again. You just have to play better and as it turned out in the second half we needed those timeouts, I needed to rest Rossiter after Josh was hurt and I needed to be able to set up our press and get organized as to what we wanted to run on offense on the next possession and we were scoring. Some guys will take (a timeout) when it's (a) 4-0 run, I'm not going to do that. I'm not going to do that but for example, in the Tennessee game I took one early because it was just mayhem and the clock wasn't stopping and we were a long way from a media timeout. Sometimes you get caught waiting for that media timeout and play goes on for four more minutes and that's when you have to stop it. I wouldn't do it any differently in the Kansas game.

On if it makes a difference if the game is on the road

Oh yeah, absolutely and there are some times when you say to yourself, I want these guys to play through it. The other night would not have been one of those nights because I've been there before. But the crazy thing was, in that run, the crowd was not nuts. Like I said, it was stoppages of play and it was a very methodical period where we just weren't getting baskets, but we were not having the wrong guys shooting the ball, we didn't have guys shooting bad shots, we got it to the rim a few times. If you see your team running what we worked on running (then I'm not going to call one). If you're completely sideways, then you have to take one; if they're totally out of character you have to take one, but they were not.

On what was gained from the non-conference schedule

I think a number of things happened. We certainly played a high level of competition, which I think will help us get better and make us understand what it takes. I think we got a tremendous amount of exposure which I think is important. We took our team on the road and put them in difficult venues. I just think that when we settle into conference play that will really help us. It remains to be seen, but I think it will help us.

On the impact Clarence Jackson can have

When he's hitting from 3, it gives everybody more space, that's exactly what happened when Tay Fisher was hitting. (But) he's diversified his game, he's doing a little more off the dribble, he still spins in traffic a little bit and has some uncharacteristic turnovers, but he does work the baseline and he can hit the runner and he can put in on the deck and get fouled. He has started to make his free throws again which I knew he would. I just want him to be an offensive weapon, not just a jump-shooter and I think he's worked on that and when he's doing that I think we're a better team.

Scouting Siena

The Saints play their sixth game of a nine-game, 21-day tour that includes stops in seven cities. The team had its five-game winning streak snapped at Kansas Tuesday night despite rallying from a 30-10 deficit to cut the Jayhawks lead to just four with seven minutes to play. Friday, the team puts its 11-game home winning streak on the line against Rider in a rematch of last year's MAAC Championship game. The Saints have begun to hit their stride on offense, reaching 80 points three of their last four times out. Point guard Ronald Moore is a major reason for the explosion as is the resurgence of MAAC Preseason Player of the Year Kenny Hasbrouck. The Saints have another quick turn following Friday's game as they travel to Manhattan Sunday to start a three-game MAAC road swing.

Scouting Rider

Rider is 8-5 overall and 3-0 in the MAAC. The Broncos are led by junior guard Ryan Thompson who is averaging 16.8 points, 6.6 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game. Thompson's brother, Jason, was the 12th pick in last spring's NBA Draft and is starring for the Sacramento Kings. His number was retired on Sunday. In addition to Ryan Thompson, Harriss Mansell (12.0 ppg) and Mike Ringgold (11.5 ppg) are both averaging double figures. Freshman Novar Gadson and sophomore Justin Robinson are contributing better than eight points per game. Rider is averaging 70.5 points per game and shooting 43.5% from the field.

Rocky Road

The Saints had an adventurous trip to Lawrence, Kan. from New York's State Capital. The team departed for Albany International Airport at 4:30 a.m. Monday following their Sunday game against Saint Peter's. They boarded the first leg of their flight for Detroit, scheduled to depart at 6 a.m. and sat on the tarmac for two hours due to difficulty deicing the airplane. After arriving in Detroit, they boarded their scheduled flight to Kansas City which was also delayed on the runway. After taking off, the plane was forced to return to Detroit due to a problem with the landing gear. Before doing so, it circled the Motor City for an hour to burn enough fuel to lighten the aircraft for landing. The Saints waited two additional hours at the Detroit Airport before boarding an uneventful flight to Kansas City which arrived at 4:30 p.m. central time and then loaded the bus for Lawrence. The trip home was thankfully less adventurous, though it too included a one-hour tarmac delay and a short sprint through the Detroit airport to make the connecting flight home.

Us Again

This will be the sixth game the Saints have played as part of the ESPN Full Court package this season and third game (of four scheduled) on ESPNU. All three games at the Old Spice Classic were nationally televised (on either ESPN2 or ESPNU) as was the Saints game at Pitt (ESPN2) and at Kansas (Jayhawk TV - ESPN Full Court). The Saints have also appeared on Regional TV twice this season (against Marist and at Holy Cross). McCaffery cited the exposure the Siena program would receive as a major reason for the team's arduous schedule.

There's No Place like Home

Siena won its 11th straight home game Sunday. It is the longest home winning streak since the start of the 1998-99 season. Siena is 114-45 (72%) since making the full-time move to the Times Union Center in 1997-98.

Duell's Status in Doubt

Senior Josh Duell missed Sunday's game with an illness, and injured his knee in the second half of the Kansas game. Freshman Kyle Downey fell on Duell's left leg, which twisted awkwardly as he dropped to the court. Duell had to be assisted off the floor and his return to the lineup is uncertain, though McCaffery indicated he would not be able to return anytime soon. Prior to sitting out Sunday's game, Duell had averaged 19 minutes over the previous six games after playing an average of just 6.6 the first seven games. Duell had made seven of the last 13 3-pointers he has attempted. The co-captain missed much of preseason workouts recovering from an Achilles injury.

Let's Go Streaking

Siena has won five of six games and eight of its last 10 since being swept in the Old Spice Classic in late November.

Welcome Back

Senior captain and MAAC Preseason Player of the Year Kenny Hasbrouck needs just 13 points to become the sixth Siena player to score 1,600 career points. Hasbrouck has reached double figures in four straight games after doing so just four times in the previous nine. Hasbrouck has led the team with 16.3 points and shot 48% from the field and 44% from 3-point range over the last four games. Hasbrouck averaged 21 points and shot 56% from the field and 63% from 3-point range in wins over Boise State and Cornell, earning MAAC Player of the Week honors for his efforts (11/24). Hasbrouck is third on the school's career steals charts with 205 - 32 shy of all-time leader Marcus Faison '00. Hasbrouck has had at least one steal in all but two games this year.

More Moore

Junior point guard Ronald Moore scored 18 points, dished out eight assist had just two turnovers and added three steals in the loss at Kansas. Moore had a career-high 20 points and added nine assists in the Fairfield win, matched up against Preseason First Team selection Jonathan Han. Moore was selected as one of 31 finalists for the Bob Cousy award before the season, presented annually to the nation's top point guard by the Basketball Hall of Fame. Moore ranks in the top-40 nationally in assists and assist/turnover ratio. His six assists per game are tie for tops in the MAAC and his 2.3/1 assist/turnover ranks first. Moore averaged 5.1 assists over his first two years and just 2.1 turnovers per game. Moore has had at least eight assists in four of the last six games. Despite his gaudy numbers, and the fact that he makes the MAAC's top offense go, he has never been selected to an All-Conference Team - including this year's Preseason MAAC teams. Moore is the only MAAC point guard to be named a Cousy finalist.

Ratings Game

According to realltimepi.com and rpiratings.com, Siena ranked 45th nationally in the Division I men's RPI as of late afternoon Thursday. The Saints were buoyed by their extremely challenging schedule which ranked 31st of the 343 Division I programs.

Stomach Bug

The Saints were recently victimized by a stomach illness that ripped through virtually the entire team. Ryan Rossiter and Josh Duell both missed the Saint Peter's game Sunday with the sickness.

Trendy

Siena is 9-2 when scoring 70 points or more this season, 7-0 at home, 8-2 in night games, 5-0 when collecting 10 steals or more, 9-1 when leading at halftime, 7-2 when recording 15 assists or more and 8-2 in front of a crowd of 5,000 or more.

MAAC Daddies

Siena began its 20th MAAC season at Loyola on December 9 with its highest expectations ever. The Saints are the unanimous choice to win the league this season, according to the Preseason Coaches' Poll released October 28. It's the second straight year Siena was picked to win the league. Last year, Siena shared the regular-season title with Rider and defeated the Broncs in the MAAC title game. Senior Kenny Hasbrouck was named Preseason MAAC Player of the Year and juniors Edwin Ubiles and Alex Franklin were selected to the Preseason First Team. Hasbrouck and Ubiles were First Team All-League selections last year. Siena is 185-133 all-time in MAAC games. Since the league expanded to its current 10 teams in 1997-98, the Saints trail only Niagara in regular-season MAAC wins.

Fast Eddie

Edwin Ubiles has reached double figures in eight of the last 10 games and 11 of 15 contests this season. He would need to improve just slightly on the 14.5 points per game he averaged entering this year (assuming the Saints play a similar number of games) to become the third Siena player ever to reach the 2000-point plateau. Ubiles scored his 1,000th career point against Tennessee in the First Round of the Old Spice Classic - his 70th game as a Saint. Ubiles led the Saints with 17 points per game as a sophomore and is leading the team in scoring again this season. He is looking to become the first Saint to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back seasons since Dwayne Archbold (00-01 and 01-02).

A's for Alex

Alex Franklin joined Ubiles and Hasbrouck on the Preseason MAAC First Team this year after earning Second Team recognition as a sophomore. Franklin scored 22 points and grabbed 13 rebounds at Holy Cross (12/30). It was his first double-double of the season (he posted 10 last year) and he ended the week averaging a double-double in Siena's three wins. Franklin has grabbed at least eight rebounds in seven of the last nine games. Franklin scored 17 points and grabbed nine rebounds against Tennessee despite missing much of the first half with two fouls. He scored 21 points and made 9-12 free throws in the win at Loyola and had 22 points and eight rebounds in the Marist win. As a sophomore, Franklin averaged 15.1 points and 7.8 rebounds per game. He has shot 50% or better from the field in 11 of the Saints' 15 games this season and is third in the MAAC in field goal percentage (55%).

A Star Emerging

Last season, Siena relied heavily on what McCaffery dubbed his "Big Four"- Hasbrouck, Ubiles, Franklin and Moore, but it appears the Saints now have a Fab Five. Although he missed Sunday's game with the stomach illness, sophomore Ryan Rossiter again demonstrated how much his game has improved at Kansas. Rossiter scored 12 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 36 minutes against the Jayhawks even though it was expected he would be able to play no more than 15 due to the illness. Rossiter finished with 11 points and nine rebounds and won the game with two free throws in the waning seconds at St. Joe's (12/28) and had 15 points and seven rebounds at Holy Cross (12/30). Rossiter is averaging 8.9 points and 6.4 rebounds per game and leads the MAAC in field goal percentage (56.6%). Rossiter has given the Saints another legitimate threat on the glass and a physical presence to counter Franklin's athleticism and offensive prowess. He scored a career-high 22 points against Oklahoma State (11/30).

Breaking it Down

This will be Siena's sixth game in 14 days. Starting with the St. Joe's game, Siena began a stretch of nine games in 21 days (December 28-January 17). Prior to the game, the team played just two games in a 17-day stretch spanning from December 10-December 27. The Saints played six games in the 13 days from November 27-December 9.

Anyone, Anytime

The Saints have assembled the most challenging schedule in the 66-year history of Siena basketball. Siena has played six games against teams that advanced to last year's NCAA Tournament (3-3). The Saints will close out their non-conference schedule when they host an ESPN BracketBusters event February 21. Siena will have at least seven games on national televised this season.

Spotlight on Clarence

Sophomore Clarence Jackson more than doubled his previous career high with 28 points at St. Joseph's (12/28). Jackson made 12-20 field goals in 27 minutes played. Perhaps most impressive was the way he scored his points. For much of his first two seasons, Jackson's game has relied on perimeter shooting and he has struggled when trying to drive the basketball. At St. Joe's, 10 of his 12 field goals came inside the 3-point arc, including several hard drives to the basket that resulted in acrobatic finishes. Jackson has averaged 11.7 points over the last seven games and he leads the team with 14.2 points and is shooting 49% on the road this season. Jackson led the Saints with nearly 20 points per game this summer in Italy.

Spreading the Wealth

Siena's bench scored 34 points against both Pitt and Saint Joseph's, marking the highest output for the reserves in a game all season. All eight players who scored against the Panthers registered at least five points. Six Saints are averaging more than 8.3 points per game and nine players are averaging nine minutes or more. That said, Siena's starters have played the bulk of the time, accounting for 148 (of the 200 minutes) per game.

Guarding the Stripe

Siena's opponents have attempted just 234 free throws and made just 163. Despite Siena's poor percentage from the foul line, Siena has made nearly as many free throws (209) as its opponents have attempted (234).

Back-To-Back-To-Back?

Siena has never won 20 Division I games three seasons in a row. The Saints won 20 games or more from 98-01, but the 00-01 team had just 19 wins against Division I opponents (defeating Division II foe Hawaii Pacific for what amounted to its 20th overall victory). Siena won 20 games in 06-07 and 23 last year.

MAAC is Back

The MAAC Tournament returns to Times Union Center (March 6-9) for the second straight season and 14th time overall. Siena will also serve as host for the 2010 conference Championships.

Fewer Threes Please

The Saints are shooting over 51% (342-670) from inside the 3-point arc this season. Siena's 4.8 3-pointers per game rank in the bottom 15% nationally. McCaffery's motion offense relies on driving the basketball and scoring in transition. Every Siena player is averaging fewer than one 3-pointers per game.

Turning up the Heat

Siena's pressure defense has forced an average of 17 turnovers and the Saints are averaging 8.5 steals per game after posting 10 steals or more in four of the last eight games. Every Siena starter is averaging at least one steal per game. Last year, Siena set a school record with 320 steals and ranked eighth nationally with 9.4 steals per game. Siena's opponents had over 200 more turnovers than the Saints did last season (over six more per game). Siena is averaging nearly 18 points per game off turnovers this season. The Saints rank in the top-40 nationally in turnover margin (+3.4).

Block Party

The Saints have averaged 4.2 blocks per game this season - nearly a full block more than last season's average. Ryan Rossiter and Edwin Ubiles are each averaging over a block per game.

Up and Down

The Saints have out-rebounded nine of their first 15 opponents, but are being out-rebounded 37.5-35.5 on the season. In the six games the Saints have been out-rebounded, the team owns a -11.2 rebounding margin.

Freeing up the Free Throws

The Saints have made 71.5% (78-109) of their free throws the last five games after making just 60% in their first 10. Siena made 14-16 tries in its one-point win at St.

Joseph's. In its narrow loss to Oklahoma State at the Old Spice Classic, the Saints were just 12-28 from the foul line.

Memorable Milestone

Head coach Fran McCaffery earned his 200th career win in the Saints victory over Loyola (12/3) - the same day that he coached in his 100th career game at Siena. McCaffery coached at Lehigh (1985-88) and UNC-Greensboro (1999-2005) prior to his arrival in Loudonville.

An A for the D

Siena's opponents have scored an average of just 69 points per game and shot 43.36 from the field. Last year, the Saints advanced to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament despite allowing its opponents to shoot 45.2% from the field. Even high-flying Tennessee and national power Pitt were held under 80 points by Siena's pressure defense. Only Fairfield (81) and Kansas (91) have cracked 80 points against the Saints this season.

Missing Magee

Junior Cory Magee has missed the first 15 games with post-concussion syndrome following an injury suffered when he took an elbow from teammate Ryan Rossiter in preseason practice. Magee recently suffered a setback in practice and his return is uncertain.

Senior Moment

Erik Harris scored four points in 13 minutes against UAlbany. It was the first time Harris was called on to play extended minutes in a very meaningful role. Harris did an admirable job in his spot action, helping the Saints maintain their lead throughout the second half. Harris was a walk-on his first three years with the program, but earned a full scholarship this season.

Great Expectations

Not only are the Saints the unanimous choice to repeat their MAAC Championship and return to the NCAA Tournament, but national expectations surrounding the program are as high as they have ever been. Siena received votes in both the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' top-25 poll and the Associated Press writer's top-25 poll the first three weeks they came out. Several national magazines and websites ranked Siena among the top-50 teams in their preseason polls.

Foreign Engagements

The Saints got a jump start on the season with a 13-day, five game foreign tour August 16-29. Tour stops included: Como, Venice, San Marino, Florence, Siena and Rome. In addition to the once-in-a-lifetime experiences involved with visiting historic sites such as: Vatican City, the Grand Canal, Michelangelo's David, The Coliseum and many more, the team got a chance to bond with one another and tone their basketball skills against professional competition. Sophomores Clarence Jackson and Ryan Rossiter led the Saints to a 4-1 record on the trip. Jackson averaged nearly 20 points per game and Rossiter averaged a double-double.

Fresh Faces

Freshmen Kyle Downey and Owen Wignot have made a serious impact this season despite the return of Siena's veteran rotation. Downey was recruited as a shooting guard and can score from the perimeter, but he will add depth at point guard as well. In his debut, Downey was second on the team with 14 points, converting 7-8 from the foul line. He has averaged 10.8 points and shooting 58% from the field when playing 15 minutes or more. Wignot is a combo forward and a superb athlete who has shown the ability to fill in on the inside when needed. He scored eight points and grabbed seven rebounds against Boise State and is shooting 50% from 3-point range this season. Both players are averaging more than nine minutes per game.

Their Back

The Saints return all five starters from last season. Additionally, Siena returns 86% of its scoring from last year's MAAC Championship team. Only senior Tay Fisher (graduation), freshman Chris DeLaRosa (transfer) and junior James Carr (transfer) do not return.

Saints Sign Three Early

O.D. Anosike, Jonathan Breeden and Denzel Yard have all returned binding National Letters of Intent. The Saints still have one scholarship to give. Anosike, a 6-foot-8, 205-pound combo forward from New Jersey averaged 16 points and 11 rebounds his junior year at Saint Peter's High School for Boys in Staten Island. Breeden, a 6-1 point guard from Harrisburg, Pa., played for Central Dauphin East and AAU basketball for Upstate Basketball Club. Yard, a guard from Philadelphia who plays for Team Philly AAU and for Franklin Learning Center, figures to help fill the position vacated by Kenny Hasbrouck's pending graduation and gives the Saints another option at point guard.

Senior captain Kenny Hasbrouck led a balanced Siena attack with 20 points as the Saints routed Boise State 82-52 in front of 6,626 in the team's season opener. Former Saint Tay Fisher '08 led the halftime ceremony as the program raised its 2008 MAAC Championship banner to the Times Union Center rafters.

In a rematch of last season's Bracketbuster blowout won by the Saints by 23 in Idaho, this season's rematch resembled a similar outcome. Siena led wire to wire and by as much as 34 in posting the program's second largest season opening win in the Division I era, trailing only a 46 point pummeling of East Stroudsburg in the 1984-85 opener.

The Saints came out of the blocks firing on all cylinders, opening the game on a 15-5 run capped by an Edwin Ubiles jumper at 13:34. Ubiles was one of six Saints who posted exactly eight points on the evening.

Boise State (1-1) trimmed the deficit to 20-15 at the 10:13 mark, but could get no closer the rest of the way. The Saints responded with a 27-13 run of their own to close out the half and head into intermission up by 19 (47-28).

Siena forced the Broncos into 13 first half turnovers, leading to 17 points. Additionally, the Saints made six first half threes while Boise struggled to find its range, going 0-9 from beyond the arc.

The Saints put the game away early in the second half, going on a 12-4 run to open the stanza finished off by a Ronald Moore three with 15:38 remaining that put Siena up 59-32. A Bob Cousy Award finalist, Moore finished with eight points and six assists without committing a turnover. On the defensive end, he shut down fellow Cousy Award nominee Anthony Thomas, holding him scoreless in the first half while the game was still hanging in the balance.

Kenny Hasbrouck scored 22 points and Ryan Rossiter posted his first career double-double as Siena pulled away from Ivy League Champion Cornell in the second half to post a 74-56 win in front of 7,575 fans at Times Union Center.

The Saints held Cornell to just 35% shooting for the game and forced 16 turnovers.

The Big Red defeated Siena 83-77 in Ithaca last year and shot 55% from the field. It was the second straight 20-point effort from Hasbrouck who played just nine minutes in the first half after picking up two fouls.

Siena led 30-26 at halftime and committed 10 fouls before intermission.

The Saints used a 9-2 run to start the second half, taking their first double-digit lead of the game, 39-38, with 18:25 left.

Cornell rallied back to within four with a 7-0 run moments later. Siena used a decisive 13-0 run to take an 18-point lead on a Hasbrouck 3-pointer with 8:43 to go. The Big Red climbed to within 12 on a Ryan Wittman 3-pointer with 5:52 left, but that was as close as the visitors would get the rest of the way.

Cornell was led in scoring by Jeff Fotte with 14 points. Geoff Reeves had 13 and Wittman finished with just 11. Wittman entered the game averaging nearly 25 points per game, but was contained by Siena junior Edwin Ubiles.

Ubiles was one of four Saints to finish with double-figures, ending with 12 points and seven rebounds. Rossiter had 10 to go along with his career-high 15 rebounds. Alex Franklin made 6-7 field goals and finished with 15 points.

Siena shot 53% from the field in the second half to finish 48% for the game. The Saints also owned a 45-36 edge in rebounding, marking the second straight time they have out-rebounded their opponent this year in as many games. Last season, Siena out-rebounded the opposition just 10 times in 33 games.

Hasbrouck finished with 13 points for the Saints and Brett Harvey had 15 for the Greyhounds to round out the double figure scorers.

Loyola shot just 3-15 from the field - a far cry from the 18 3's they Greyhounds made in an 85-56 win here last January.

Cole Aldrich had a career-high 24 points and 13 rebounds as defending National Champion Kansas held off Siena, 91-84 in front of 16,300 at Allen Fieldhouse.

Siena opened the game on a flurry, quickly jumping out to a 9-5 lead in the opening four minutes. Kansas responded however with a game-changing 25-1 run of its own to build a 20-point cushion at 30-10 at the midway point of the first half.

The Jayhawks let Siena back in it before pulling out their 33rd straight win at Allen Fieldhouse, the nation's third-longest home-court winning streak.

Sherron Collins had 18 points for Kansas and Tyrel Reed added a career-high 14.

Siena fell into a huge hole early but never gave up, staying close by hitting 10-of-21 from 3-point range. Kansas extended its lead to 59-43 at the 14:55 mark of the second half before the Saints stormed back with a 22-10 run to pull within 69-65 on Kyle Downey's hard drive with 7 1/2 minutes left in the game, but couldn't get any closer.

Ronald Moore led the Saints with 18 points and eight assists while Clarence Jackson added 17 and Kenny Hasbrouck 16 as Siena saw its five game winning streak snapped.

Siena was efficient on the offensive end, shooting 47.8% from the floor while accumulating 19 assists. KU meanwhile held a 42-29 edge on the glass and converted 26 of 32 foul shots (81.3%) including some key makes late to put the game away.
